Instructions: Use the grid below to help you keep track of the more prominent characters in the book. You might wish to add more details as you go along. Our family remembers Cabeza de Vaca because his name translates to “Head of Cow,” a name bestowed on his family as a symbol of honor. My children remember Dorantes by remembering his name sounds vaguely like Doritos. And Castillo is remembered as the “Priest who lived in a “Castle” (Castillo in Spanish).
